- VI. Guest Speakers
 - A. Mr. Tron Lippett, Assistant Director, Enrollment Management, Broward College,



Bridge2Life discussed the program "Rising Seahawks". The Rising Seahawks team focuses on training high school students to become college advisors. Through this program, Broward College provides college-readiness information, financial aid assistance, college application courses, and presents students with new initiatives and opportunities. Mr. Lippett also informed BCASC that if any council is ever in need of guest speakers, or anyone to help conduct college-readiness seminars, he is glad to and provided his email (tlippett@broward.edu) as well as the program's Instagram profile (@bridge2life) Mr. Lippett also discussed various conferences such as an Anime conference occurring in January of 2022, as well as a Youtuber conference occurring in February 2022. Through these events and efforts, the program has expanded opportunities for students, including monetary incentives for conducting student-led projects that raise awareness of equity and cultural gaps.

B. Ms. Jackie Rosen, FISP Consultant, Former FISP CEO, FISP co-Creator, HOPE Club Creator, shared with leaders that the HOPE Sunshine Club (Helping Overcome Problems Effectively) helps students and informs them in ways on how to live a happy, healthy, and successful life with friends and family, while also actively having fun and helping others.
