Projects (all projects must be completed by the March BCASC meeting)

- **1. Wellness Wednesday** Every Wednesday councils will share mental health tips and practice wellness activities. Resources available at https://work2bewell.org/curriculum/mental-wellness/
- **2. Collaboration Project** Conduct a collaborative project with your feeder elementary or middle school. The project can be of the school's choosing.
- 3. Harvest/Food Drive Member schools participate in Harvest Drive or any other food drive program.
- **4. Human Trafficking Awareness Project** Human trafficking is the use of any person under the age of 18 for sexual purposes in exchange for—or for the promise of—money, goods, or services by a non-caregiver. If the sex trafficking victim is under the age of 18, it is human trafficking, regardless of whether force, fraud, and/or coercion exist. Conduct a human trafficking awareness project of your choosing. Chairperson will provide information/ideas at the BCASC meetings.
- **5. Appreciation Project** Conduct an appreciation project of your choosing. Examples below.

Events

- 1. **Middle School Leadership Workshop** The Middle School Student Leader Workshop is a day-long workshop for middle school student council, junior honor society, and Future Educators of America leaders. This officer workshop is hosted by the Broward County Association of Student Councils and high school student leaders from BCASC member schools are the facilitators.
- 2. **Broward Students Ethics Forum** This is a unique conference in that all the topics to be discussed and all the facilitators are high school students. The purpose of this forum is to allow students the opportunity to identify and discuss ethical issues that affect them daily while helping them enhance their decision-making ability and promote socially responsible conduct.
- **3. Wacky Olympics** High school teams will host events and enter teams of up to 20 players each. Middle schools will enter teams but are not required to host games. The entry fee is \$100/high school team and \$50/middle school team. The games are icebreakers and silly games. A school can enter more than one team. All funds collected will go to Special Olympics.
- **5. County Dodgeball Tournament** BCASC sponsors the annual County Dodgeball Tournament. High school teams will pay \$100 to register and middle schools will pay \$50. All funds collected will go to a non-profit organization chosen by the participants.
- **6. Broward Student Leaders Day** The annual Broward Student Leaders Day will be held at TBA. Each high school is entitled to send 10 delegates, at a cost of \$20 per delegate. Seniors are not eligible to attend as delegates. Underclass student leaders approved by the school's administration and potential leaders (i.e., club and class officers) are eligible to attend the conference.
