

BCASC Campaign Rules & Additional Information

If you are running for a BCASC office and are campaigning, please adhere to the following rules:

- In the BCASC the school not the individual student holds the office.
- Once the school has received confirmation that their Intent to Run Form has been received by the Office of Student Activities, each candidate school may campaign on the following social medias: Twitter, Instagram, and the Band App. You must follow BCASC in order to campaign on that medium.
- Each candidate school will be allowed a total of six minutes to make a presentation (one minute to set up, five minutes for the presentation). This includes those running unopposed. Please note the six-minute time period starts as soon as the candidate school is introduced.
- In the first general session, each candidate school will be required to make a speech not exceeding one minute in length.
- In the general session in which the election is to be conducted and prior to the actual election, each candidate school will be required to make a speech not exceeding two minutes in length. This speech must be delivered by the student who will hold the position if the school wins the election.
- Each candidate school is allowed two (2) banners. The maximum size of a banner is 36 inches by 10 feet.
- Each candidate school is allowed 10 regular size posters (22x24). The posters can be hung or carried but the total number cannot exceed 10.
- Only “painters’ tape” (blue tape) may be used to hang banners unless otherwise specified by the convention host school. Schools must bring their own tape.
- Each candidate school may have up to four hand-outs (Note: candy attached to a piece of election material equals two handouts).
- Homemade baked goods of any kind are prohibited.
- All candidate schools are expected to take down all their banners and posters by the conclusion of lunch.
- There can be no glitter, stickers or confetti of any kind.
